Announcing: 2023 LOY “COME BACK TO TEACH” EDUCATION GRANTS

The Winchester Education Foundation is pleased to announce the continuation of the **Loy “Come Back to Teach” Education Grants**. These grants, funded by a testamentary trust of the late Mindy J. Loy, John Handley Class of 1974, have been established to assist graduates of John Handley High School who pursue careers in PreK-12 education.

The goals of the Loy “Come Back to Teach” Education Grants are to assist Handley High School graduates who have decided to “come back” to serve as educators, administrators and other certificated professionals in the Winchester Public Schools, to promote recruitment and retention by WPS of outstanding education professionals, and, to the extent possible, to promote a racially and ethnically diverse professional faculty by encouraging employment of persons of underrepresented populations.

- “Come Back” Education Grant Type One: One or more grants in the amount of up to \$5,000 will be awarded to Handley graduates, from any graduation year, who are newly hired since July 1, 2022 by Winchester Public Schools to work in a position that requires a professional certificate. Recipients may not receive this type of Education Grant more than one time.
- “Come Back” Education Grant Type Two: One or more grants in the amount of up to \$2,500 will be awarded to Handley graduates, from any graduation year, who are and have been employed by Winchester Public Schools in a position that requires a professional certificate for at least two years prior to the application date. Recipients may not receive this type of Education Grant more than one time.

- A recipient of a Loy “Come Back” Education Grant of any type must agree to remain with WPS for two additional school years following award of the grant, assuming WPS offers the recipient employment contracts in those years. Repayment will be expected if a recipient fails to remain with WPS for two additional years.
- Funds from a Loy “Come Back” Education Grant may be used in one of three ways:
 - (1) Direct payment by WEF on outstanding student loan obligations for tuition incurred by the recipient in obtaining his or her education or professional degree or in continuing coursework toward additional degrees related to the recipient’s professional position.
 - (2) Reimbursement by WEF to the recipient for tuition expenses paid out-of-pocket by the recipient within the preceding 24-month period for obtaining his or her education or professional degree or in continuing coursework toward acquisition of additional degrees related to the recipient’s professional position, provided that documentation of out-of-pocket payment by recipient is provided.
 - (3) Direct payment by WEF for tuition expenses to an institution of higher learning in which recipient is enrolled in order to acquire an additional degree related to his or her professional position, provided that the recipient is employed by WPS at the time that the disbursement is made.
- Requests for distribution of funds must be made on the Request for Distribution form to be provided by WEF, with supporting documentation. All requests for distribution must be received by WEF within two years of the award. Funds not used within two years are subject to forfeiture.
